The movie, Believe in Me, based on the real experiences of Oklahoma basketball coach Jim Keith during the 1960s, opens today at Durant Twin Cinema as part of Oklahoma's Centennial.

Believe In Me is based on the novel "Brief Garland," written by a Newbury author Harold Keith. Jim Keith said his uncle told him, "This is going to be your story."

The movie follows a young coach, Clay Driscoll, as he unexpectedly learns he is going to be coaching a losing girls' basketball team instead of boys' basketball. He eventually leads the Lady Cyclones to the state tournament.

"Back in those days, coaching girls' basketball was like walking the plank," said Keith.

Keith said after working with the girls' team he enjoyed working more with them than the boys.

"It was about giving them freedom to be themselves, and needing someone to believe in them," said Keith.

The director and screenwriter of Believe in Me, Robert Collector, came across the book and, after acquiring the rights, learned he could meet with Keith, on whom the book was based.

"I nearly fainted," said Keith when he found out the book was being turned into a film. "I was a little flabber-

gasted. It was a great stroke of luck for me," said Collector. "It began a wonderful friendship."

Collector said when Jim and his wife visited the set, the cast knew these weren't made-up characters.

"When a question of what the character would do in a given situation came up, I would give him a call," said Collector. "That was different and very unique for me."
